Dayspring Center has provided 3,000 meals to families every month as they heal from trauma, secure employment, and find permanent stable housing.



Wellspring has served 143 unhoused children as they assist families in Morgan County with shelter, advocacy, and support.



Brookside Community Development Corporation opened 2 new transitional housing units, one serving women and their children, on Indy's near east side.



Through a new Workforce Development Program, 91 Place now owns and operates The Neidhammer Coffee Company where it employs formally homeless youth.



Over 90% of Pathway to Recovery's program residents are substance free, employed, and have attained healthcare upon exiting into permanent housing of their own.



Outreach Indiana served 487 unhoused youth and young adults, connecting them with basic needs and housing solutions.



Sheltering Wings received and served 750 crisis calls as their helpline continues to be the first resource for victims of domestic violence in central Indiana.

Hope For Survivors

of individuals served by Foundation grantee organizations are survivors of domestic violence.

In just the first half of this year, REALTOR® Foundation grantees have served over 700 victims of domestic violence. Intimate partner violence is the leading cause of homelessness for women and their children in Indiana, making up 30% of those sheltered by our community partners. Unfortunately, crisis calls from survivors fleeing abuse have been on the rise since 2020.

Victims of intimate partner violence are often isolated from their family and friends as a means of separation by their abusers, who use threats and violence to gain complete control of the victim's life. When she finds a means of escape, too often she is left with no support, transportation, or money. Many live in derelict hotels or move from floor to floor until they run out of options.

Janice, a mother of three, courageously gathered her children and fled her abusive home. With nowhere else to turn, she found Holy Family Shelter, and within hours staff had Janice and her children safe in emergency housing. The family was given food, clothing, personal care items, and cookware; as well as asthma medicine for the middle child. The next day, Janice met with a case manager who helped her identify her needs and set goals for healing, stability, and independence. She was accepted into a rapid rehousing program where she moved into an apartment with her children.

Because of the emergency and transitional housing services supported by REALTOR® Foundation grants, Janice was able to begin counseling services, obtain childcare, increase her employment hours, form a budget, and obtain safe and secure housing. This was the first time in a very long time that she and her children felt safe in her own bed.
